The Souma City Disaster Volunteer Center is run jointly by various organizations and people such as associations and local companies, former city workers, teachers of local high schools, and by workers of the Kanto block Social Welfare Council. The center is led by Dai Konno of the Municipal Social Welfare Council. The center opened on the second floor of the Chamber of Commerce on the 21st of March (Mon), 10 days after the earthquake.

When asked why the center could operate smoothly under such difficult circumstances, Mr. Konno replied, "I guess it's because I enjoy the challenge."
